



Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve




Fig.3 Typical Output Characteristics(I)




Fig.4 Typical Output Characteristics(II)




Fig.5 Breakdown Voltage vs.
Junction Temperature




Fig.6 Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig.7 Gate Threshold Voltage vs.
Junction Temperature





Fig.8 Forward Transfer Admittance vs.

Fig.9 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage




Fig.10 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State
Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)




Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (II)




Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State
Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)




Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State
Resistance vs. Drain Current (IV)




Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (V)




Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (VI)




Fig.17 Typical Capacitance vs.

Drain - Source Voltage




Fig.18 Switching Characteristics





Fig.19 Source Current vs.


Fig. 1-1 SWITCHING TIME MEASUREMENT CIRCUIT


